Who are they?

HQIP was established in 2008 to increase the impact that clinical audit has on healthcare quality improvement. HQIP are led by: Academy of Royal Medical Colleges, The Royal College of Nursing and National Voices. HQIP's stated vision is: 'to improve healthcare outcomes by enabling those who commission, deliver and receive healthcare to measure and improve our healthcare services'. HQIP are based in London and hold the contract to reinvigorate audit with NHS England.




What they offer

Via their contract with NHS England, HQIP are charged with reinvigorating local and national audit. Their work programme predominantly focuses on national audit and in effect HQIP are responsible for the managing and commissioning the National Clinical Audit and Patient Outcomes Programme (NCAPOP) which incorporates national audits and the Clinical Outcomes Review Programme. In addition, HQIP support local clinical audit via the publication of best practice guidance, supporting local events and training, funding NQICAN, etc.

Facts and figures

HQIP manage over 30 national audits via NCAPOP, plus 8 Clinical Outcome Review Programmes and the National Joint Registry. As of July 2017, HQIP's website provides access to over 500 resources, mostly NCA reports and documents to assist on delivery of audit at a local level. HQIP have a core team of more than 30 staff plus trustees and board members. For financial year 2015-2016 HQIP reported £24.4 million income. HQIP is an independent charity.
