REINVIGORATION

UNSTOPPABLE SSNAP



Well done to NELA. 2nd place for the second year running.

BAD NEWS

Only 12.7% stated national audit has been reinvigorated

This is the lowest result since we first asked this question in 2015. Only 14.5% felt that local audit has been reinvigorated.

NATIONAL AUDITS

The quality of National Clinical Audits is a frequent talking point and a key element of the reinvigoration agenda. In 2019, 114 respondents rated NCAs via our survey. 'Moderate' was the top response for the tenth straight year, but there was a drop in NCA's rated 'excellent' or 'good' (from 37.8% down to 31.6%).

HOW NCAs RATE

Good/Excellent

31.6% of respondents rated NCAs as good or excellent.

Moderate

48.2% of respondents rated NCAs as moderate.

Poor/Very Poor 20.2% of respondents rated NCAs as poor or very poor. COMPARING THE DATA OVER TIME


59% of respondents stated that they intended to remain working in clinical audit in 5 years time. In the previous survey in 2018 this figure was 65%.

3% rated patient involvement in clinical audit as 'good' (same as 2017 and 2018). Over eight years from 2012-19 the highest rating for 'good' was just 6% (2013).

84% stated that local audits were 'more effective at improving patient care' when compared to national clinical audits (up from 77% in 2018).

Feelings towards clinical audit

One of the key questions asked every year is 'do you feel more positive or negative about clinical audit than you did a year ago'? The results this year (see below) are similar to those in 2018. 'Positive' up from 44.8% in 2018 to 44.9% in 2019.





PARTICIPANTS THANKS TO ALL WHO TOOK PART

- Data was collected online using Survey Monkey (Nov/Dec 2019)
- 161 respondents completed the survey
- 60% identified themselves as 'clinical audit professional'
- 61% had worked in clinical audit 1-10 years (39% >10 years)
- 53% worked in the acute sector
- Response rates to all questions were extremely high.
